NFA Forms to be Tracked



If you have been involved with the world of NFA for any amount of time you are aware that the time needed to process a form continues to grow. It's not just Form 4's or Form 1's. All of the forms are taking longer because the volume of applications is up and the number of folks processing the forms is not. That is a recipe for delay. But just what can the applicant expect?

In the past, an applicant had to be content with casting their form application to the wind and waiting patiently. Dealers and manufacturers would offer guesses as to receipt, but that was all they could offer. Occasionally, NFA Branch would offer historical data to provide a glimpse as to how much

work had been processed. Those were valuable, but not predictive. Our community needs more!
